

Holy Week

TAIZÉ FOR HOLY WEEK: As we begin the Holy Week journey on Sunday, April 10, a service in the Taizé tradition will be held this evening at 6:30pm in the sanctuary. This service, filled with candlelight, will offer time for silent prayer and reflection, sung prayer, and thoughtful words to help us begin this journey to the Cross.

MAUNDY THURSDAY COMMUNION SERVICE - 7:00 p.m. - Sanctuary - Thursday, April 14

Thursday of this week is called "Maundy Thursday." This term is derived from the Old French maunde and from the Latin mandatum novum, "a new commandment." This new commandment of Christ was to love one another and was given on the night before his death (John 13:34). On this night we remember and celebrate the final supper Jesus shared with his disciples in the context of Passover. This event, which reveals the holiness of all subsequent meals eaten in his name, institutes the mystery of his abiding redemptive presence in the church's celebrations of the Lord's Supper. This evening also marks the beginning of the most solemn and joyful celebration of the entire Christian Year.

Join us for this Holy Week communion service as we enter what Augustine referred to as "the triduum (three days) during which the Lord died, was buried, and rose again." Communion will be served.

GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE - Noon in the Sanctuary - Friday, April 15

This brief service commemorates the suffering and death of Christ. Dating from the 8th century, Tenebrae was originally celebrated on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday of Holy Week. Tenebrae is Latin for "shadows" and a Tenebrae Service is one in which light fades into darkness, as the sanctuary candles are extinguished with each of the scripture readings that tells the story of the betrayal and death of Jesus. This is symbolic of the physical darkness that fell over the earth as the Son of God was crucified; symbolic of the fading spiritual light of the world as Christ, the Light, was leaving it; and symbolic of the fading of loyalty of the disciples and our own betrayal of Christ. With its movement from light to dark, the Tenebrae Service prepares us to receive the Light of Easter morning ~ to celebrate the joyous news of the resurrection.

EASTER SUNDAY - 8:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. - Sanctuary - Sunday, April 17

On this day celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ, we join with the community of believers in every time and place as the Gospel is proclaimed, the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper is shared, and hymns and anthems are sung, accompanied by brass, timpani and organ. Communion will be served.

EASTER SUNDAY FLOWERING THE CROSS: Bring fresh flowers of the season on Easter Sunday, April 17, to "flower the cross," which will be planted in the Davis Street lawn.

EASTER ACTIVITIES FOR CHILDREN: All children are invited to attend Sunday school in Room 224 at 9:45 a.m. on Easter morning (April 17) to "Live Like Jesus" and participate in the rock-n-egg hunt.
