THE PASCHAL CANDLE is lighted throughout the Easter season (the fifty days between Easter Day and the Day of Pentecost), and it represents the splendor and glory of Jesus' resurrection and the light of Jesus the Messiah coming into the world. The candle should be burning as the congregation assembles for worship. The wick of the candle represents the humanity of Jesus, and the halo of the flame represents his divinity. The candle is decorated with the cross and a lamb, both symbols of Jesus Christ. The two medallions in which the Alpha and Omega (the beginning and ending letters of the Greek alphabet) are encircled represent the two full millennia (the first 20 centuries) thus far of Jesus' reign on earth. After the Day of Pentecost, two other occasions call for the lighting of the Paschal candle: when our worship includes the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism (signifying the Spirit and fire that John the Baptizer promised to all who are baptized in the name of Jesus Christ), and during funeral or memorial services of worship (as a reminder of the hope of the resurrection into which Christians are baptized.) Our Paschal Candles were gifts to the congregation by Cheryl Thompson Holt (the sanctuary candle, in honor of her husband, George) and James Wade and Ellen Spivey Harrison (the chapel candle, honoring the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry Allen Ogden.)

**WORSHIP SERVICE CDS AVAILABLE EACH WEEK:** Each Sunday, the Scripture readings, anthem, and sermon will be recorded on CD. A limited number of copies will be available immediately after the 11:00 a.m. worship service in the narthex. Additional copies may be requested by calling the church office. This same recording will be posted on the website.
