



Adults/Youth - Pattern of Divine Possibility: An Advent Search - Step into a journey of discovery this Advent with a devotional that challenges us to see beyond familiar binaries and embrace the complex, natural patterns of our creator in the world. In this devotional, Outlook Editor/Publisher Teri McDowell Ott invites us to open our eyes to the intricate designs of God's creation that often go unnoticed. In a world dominated by binary thinking – light vs. dark, good vs. evil – this devotion encourages us to look for the more, to recognize that God's patterns are nuanced, complex, and always beyond the limited constructs we impose.
